



## Making Camp Safe for Everyone

In order to prevent a major influenza outbreak the County has made some recommendations for camps and campers.

Campers are to wash their hands frequently with soap and warm water. Campers are to cover their mouth when they cough or sneeze. Among other things, the camp will continue to clean doorknobs, faucets, and handrails daily.

Riverside County Health Department is recommending that no one having an influenza-like illness (ILI) in the 7 days preceding camp be allowed to attend a summer camp program.

If a camper has been exposed to novel H1N1 or an ILI but has no symptoms they may attend but should self-monitor and report any symptoms immediately to the camp's first aide director.



Campers exhibiting ILI symptoms will be separated from the general camp population until their parent or guardian can pick them up or be taken for medical care.
